EMMA: Cool! Let's do another experiment! Let's pour (5) **a few** / **a little** cold water onto some ice cubes and see what happens.

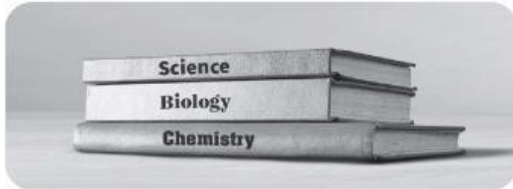
