

Tom Sawyer

Tom Sawyer is the fictional character of Mark Twain in his novel *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*. Tom is 12 years old and lives in St. Petersburg by the Mississippi River. The novel takes place in 1845. His best friends are Joe Harper and Huckleberry Finn. He lives with his brother Sid, his cousin Mary and his aunt Polly. He is totally infatuated with Becky Thatcher.

Tom is extremely *content* with his life. His aunt Polly thinks that his brain has no *content*, because he never pays attention to her words.

He has a vivid *bass* voice and big eyes. He enjoys fishing and hanging out with friends. *Bass* species are probably his favorite fish as they live in rivers, *too*. He never catches *two* fish at once. Sometimes, he looks at the river in *minute* detail, but he cannot see fish in less than a *minute*.

Tom always thinks of Becky. He used to give her a yellow *rose* when the sun *rose*, but now he is too shy. During the summer, Tom *lies* under the shade of oak trees. He also *lies* to his aunt Polly when he has not done his chores.

Huckleberry Finn looks like an *eight* year old, but he is twelve. He is the son of a vagabond and he barely *ate* as a little boy. He has *been* poor all his life and he would like to have a hot *bean* dish for dinner once in a while. He has gone through difficult moments and has *seen* a horrible *scene* at the bar corner. He tries to live happily by the river playing with Tom everyday.
