GRAMMAR Future Continuous

We use the Future Continuous to talk about actions that will be in progress at a specific time in the future.

+ She'll be sailing in August.

- We won't be studying for exams in two weeks' time.

? Will they be living abroad in five years' time?
 When will you be travelling?

We can use the Future Continuous with time expressions:
 in August/three years' time at 5 o'clock
 this time next week/month
