


Hortatory Text


Definition?

Hortatory exposition text is a type of persuasive text that presents arguments or reasons to influence the listener or reader that something should or should not be done.





SOCIAL FUNCTION



to persuade the reader or listener to do or forbid a certain action.





Generic Structure?

1. Thesis

In this section the author introduces the main topic or idea to be discussed.



2. Arguments

In this section the author presents arguments or opinions that support the main idea of the author.

3. Recommendation


This section invites the reader to take action or change their attitude according to the statement of opinion that has been presented.





Language Features

1. The author is the first-person point of view.
2. Uses abstract nouns (culture, courage, hope, policy, profit).
3. Uses action verb (tell, argue, implement).
4. Uses modal adverb (surely, certainly, definitely, clearly)



5. Uses temporal connectives (firstly, secondly, thirdly)
6. Uses evaluative words (effective, efficient, trustworthy, valuable)
7. Uses simple present tense
8. Uses passive voice

Example of Hortatory Text



Monitoring Kids While Watching TV
