Should we be worried about ROBOTS?

The word 'robot' first appeared in Karel Čapek's 1920 play *RER*, which portrayed robots ¹ _____ as factory workers before they rebelled and began to kill their human bosses. At the time, real robots ² _____ invented, but today they are a part of our lives.
