Easy there, Jackie Chan! → calm down, take it easy.

What kind is it? → What brand is it?

Inexpensive → affordable, cheap, low-cost, budget-friendly

Use of the expressions

The printer is a lemon. (a dud, a stinker, a trash)

She taps him on the shoulder to get his attention

What kind is that car?

This bicycle is inexpensive (cheap).
