Early Life

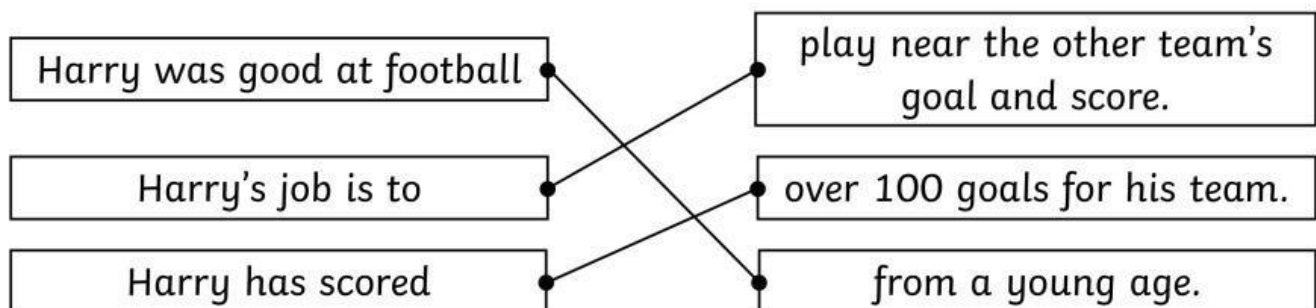
