I. Write down the comparative and the superlative !

If a one-syllable adjectives ends in –e, you just add –r to form the comparative, and –st to form the superlative.

These a one-syllable adjectives ends with a consonant and have a single vowel before the consonant. Double the last consonant of these adjective before adding –er to form the comparative, and –est to form the superlative.
