RULE:

add **-ly** to the adjective



Quiet >>> **Quietly**

Beautiful >>> **Beautifully**

Loud >>> **Loudly**



Some acomodate the suffix:

Enthusiastic >>> **Enthusiastically**

Happy >>> **Happily**

Terrible >>> **Terribily**

True >>> **Truly**

Fast >>> **Fast**


Hard >>> **Hard**

Late >>> **Late**


Straight >>> **Straight**
