

Verbs for Present, Past and Future

Jane **bakes** muffins today.

The verb **bakes** tells about now. It ends with **-s**.

Jane **baked** muffins yesterday.

The verb **baked** tells about the past. It ends with **-ed**.

Jane **will bake** muffins tomorrow.

The verb **will bake** tells about the future. It begins with **will**.
