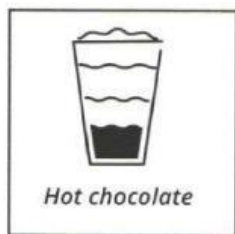

The origin of the European coffee shop

The rainiest city in Ukraine with the highest number of cafes and coffee shops per capita and every fifth person there is a student... This is all true about Lviv which is also believed by many **1** of European coffee culture. Ukrainians and Viennese have been arguing for centuries over the issue. Both countries are still in the thick of this debate. However, many believe it can be traced back to a Ukrainian war hero – named Yuri Kulczycki – who brewed the first cup of coffee in Vienna sometime soon after the Battle for Vienna in 1683, in **2**.

Before the battle Kulczycki was a Cossack with a quirky moustache who came to Vienna to trade and nothing could prevent him from becoming successful. He had spent years on the battlefield and in captivity in Turkey, which is where he **3**. When the Ottoman troops laid siege to Vienna, he volunteered to sneak through the enemy camp and persuade the Polish army to rescue the imperial city. Dressed as an Ottoman merchant and able to speak fluent Turkish, he accomplished the mission and saved the city. This opened up the fantastic possibility of becoming a businessman for him. As the spoils of the war were divided, he apparently only wanted **4**.



as his reward. Kulczycki then found a highly practical application for his prize.

Kulczycki used the same equipment and technology as he had seen in Turkey, which fascinated the customers. Kulczycki's coffee house, where he roasted his aromatic trophy and famously added milk and sugar **5** no longer exists, but in Lviv you can experience those early flavours in its reincarnated namesake, Under the Blue Bottle.

To find it, turn into a tiny alley off the main Rynok Square and then keep walking down the old cobbled street **6** with a blue bottle over it. These directions have eluded many visitors, but it is worth the hunt. And if you fail, no worries, coffee is indispensable in Lviv, so you are sure to get yourself a cup.

'Ukrainian Hand' in Hollywood

Born in Kerch, a Ukrainian film engineer, inventor and businessman Anatolii Kokush continues to make a significant **1**_____ to the international film-making industry. He even received two Oscar awards in 2006.
