Speculation	A disagreement or dispute, typically prolonged and public, often involving differing viewpoints or opinions.
Iconic	Declared not guilty of a crime or wrongdoing, typically by a court of law.
Evidence	The act or process of bringing a legal action against someone accused of a crime.
Acquitted	The quality of being trusted, reliable, or believable.
Murder	The act of forming opinions or conclusions based on incomplete information, often involving conjecture or guesswork.
Domestic violence	Widely recognized and admired, typically representing something significant or emblematic.
Low-speed chase	Information or facts indicating whether a belief or proposition is true or valid.
Controversy	Violent or aggressive behavior within the home, typically involving physical abuse between partners or family members.
Credibility	A pursuit involving a vehicle moving at a relatively slow pace, often by law enforcement, to apprehend a suspect.
Prosecution	The unlawful killing of one person by another, typically with premeditation or malice aforethought.
