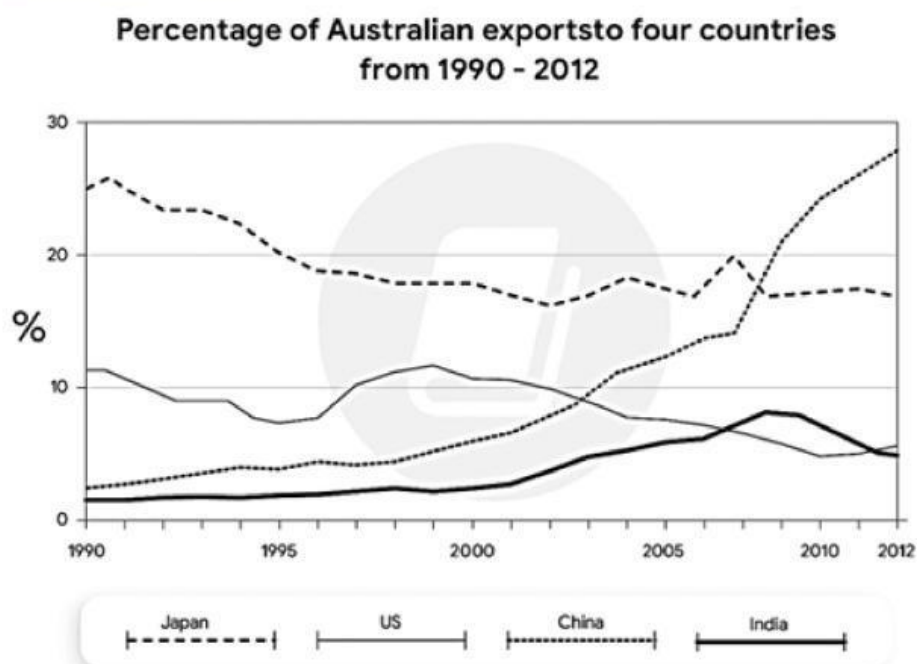


Complete the following description of the graph below, using the given words.

The graph below shows the percentage of Australian exports to four countries from 1990 to 2012. Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features, and make comparisons where relevant.



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The line graph provides into the proportion of Australian goods exported to four different countries over a 22-year periodfrom 1990 to 2012.

Overall, what stands out from the graph is that the figures for Japan and the US demonstrated general downward trends while the opposite was true for China and India over the period Another striking feature is that Japan held the position at the beginning, which was then by China at the end of the period.

In detail, China and India, the export values to these two countries both rises during the first 17 years, with the rising more sharply to roughly 15% and the reaching just under 10%. However, over the last years, the figure for Chinato just below 30% whereas the other witnessed a gradual reduction to 5%.

On the contrary, with respect to Japan, starting at a(n)25% at the beginning, its figure declined by around 10% over the first 10 years, followed by a fluctuation below 20% in 2012. Similarly, despite a(n)recovery to just over 10% in the late 1990s, the proportion of Australian goods exported to the US showed a downward trend to around 5% at the end of the
