The world's earliest writing system seems to have been used by the Sumerians, who lived in the Middle East, where Iraq is today. They had a kind of picture writing with over 1500 signs for different objects, numbers and other ideas. **A** ___, then baked to preserve the writing.

Where did the complicated Sumerian writing system come from? Who invented it or was it developed from an earlier, simpler writing system used by somebody else? **B** ___,

but archaeologists have not found another writing system although they have excavated thousands of sites in the Middle East.

The archaeologist Denise Schmandt-Besserat has an interesting theory: **C** ___. These small things were used for keeping records. Almost everywhere in the Middle East they have found them in different shapes: cones, discs, pyramids and cylinders. The earliest ones date from 10500 years ago at about the time when farming was beginning.

When the first cities grew, the clay objects were like spheres filled with as many stones as animals or goods sent to the cities. But later people had the idea of marking the outside of the sphere: **D** ___. And as time went on, the pictures were used to write other kinds of messages. Writing has begun and spread all across Western Asia.
