### 1. REPORTED STATEMENTS

1. "We have moved into our new flat". My friend said
2. Japan is a densely populated city". The teacher said
3. "My parents have already seen this film". He said
4. "I know exactly what she did yesterday". He told me
5. "My sister is working now". He said
6. "I'll help you with those exercises tomorrow". Tony said
7. "I was waiting for the bus when he arrived". She told me
8. "I didn't go to the party". She said
9. "We must see these movies tonight". They said
10. "I am sure I saw you here last week." My father told Ben

### 2. YES / NO QUESTIONS

1. "Do you live in the country Peter?" He asked me
2. "Did you see Charles yesterday morning"? They wanted to know
3. "Will we get there on time, John?" She wanted to know
4. "Don't you know the traffic regulations?" The policeman asked
5. "Can you do your best boys?" The coach wanted to know
6. "Are we going to start work tomorrow?" He asked

EXAMPLES	
She <b>claims to be</b> innocent.	He <b>admitted stealing</b> the money.
She <b>claims that</b> she is innocent.	He <b>admitted that</b> he had stolen the money.
He <b>promised to call</b> every day.	She <b>insisted on seeing</b> her lawyer.
He <b>promised that</b> he would call every day.	She <b>insisted that</b> she needed her lawyer.

### 1. TO + INFINITIVE

"I will do it" he promised

He **promised to do** it

### 2. OBJECT PRONOUN + TO INFINITIVE

"You should do it" he advised me.

He **advised me to do** it

### 3. VERB WITH PREPOSITION + -ING / VERBS FOLLOWED BY GERUND

"Let's go to the cinema now" he suggested.

He **suggested going** to the cinema then

### 4. THAT CLAUSE (SUBJECT + VERB)

He **suggested (that) we go** to the cinema

## 5. REPORTING VERBS

1. "You should see a doctor, Mrs Clark" He advised
2. "I'll bring my CDs to the party" She promised
3. "Let's go to the concert tonight, shall we? She suggested
4. "Let's go to the concert tonight, shall we? She suggested that
5. "Come to my party next weekend" My friend invited
6. "I'll drive you to school" My father offered
7. "Sorry, I won't be late again" The student apologised to the teacher for
