Singular

Affirmative:

There's a TV.

There's an armchair.

Negative:

There's no sofa.

There's no balcony.

Questions:

Is there a washing machine?

Yes, there is. No, there's not. (No, there isn't.)

We use *some* and *any* with plural nouns. We use *some* in affirmative sentences when more than one thing or person exists, but we don't say exactly how many.

There are some chairs in the classroom.

There are some new students in our class.

I have some books in my bag.

We use *any* in negative sentences and questions with plural nouns. We use *no* after an affirmative verb and with a singular or plural noun.

There are no tables. / There aren't any tables.

I have no brothers or sisters. / I don't have any brothers or sisters.

Are there any shelves in the bedroom?

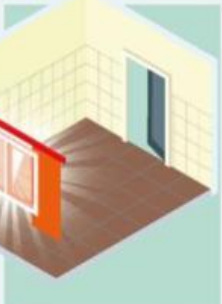

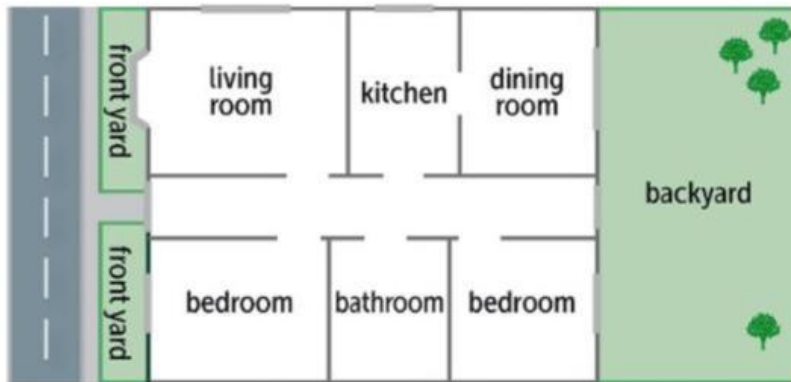
