


The chart and graph below give information about three categories of workers in Australia and the unemployment levels within those groups. Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features, and make comparisons where relevant.

The pie chart illustrates information about the workforce in Australia according to their place of birth in 2003 while the line graph gives into the levels of unemployment within those groups over a 10-year period from 1993 to 2003.

From an overall, employees born in Australia held the position in 2003. In addition, although the figure for NES groups were higher in comparison with the others, the overall unemployment rates of all categories saw over the period in question.

With respect to the pie chart, a of the workers in this country were of Australian nationality, at more than three-quarters. As for the NES and ESC groups, the former was followed by the latter, 14% and a 10% respectively.

Regarding the line graph, having from an impressive 7% to around 3% over the first 5 years, the unemployment level of the workers from non-English speaking countries fluctuated at this point during the rest of the timeframe. Similarly, the figure for the workers born in Australian and those from English speaking countries both falls over the period although they went down at a slighter, reaching 2% and a mere 1% in turn.
