## QUANTIFIERS AND DIALOGUES!

Look at the chart below. Here you are going to find the quantifiers classification and the order of degree as regards quantity,

	COUNTABLE	UNCOUNTABLE
100%	ALL (todos) EVERY (cada/cada uno)	
	A LOT OF (un montón de)	
	MANY (muchos)	MUCH (mucho)
	SOME (alguno/algunos)	
	A FEW (unos pocos)	A LITTLE (un poco/poco)
	ANY (ningún/ninguno)	
0%	NO	

Let's practice the uses for the quantifiers and intonation with the following dialogues. Decide which the quantifier we need and if we can use falling or rising intonation.

★ Waitress: **Hello, how much / many glasses of wine do you want?**

Customer: **Two, please. How much / many for the Merlot?**

Waitress: **Excuse me, sir. We have no / any Merlot left.**

★ Customer: **Hello! I want all / much the tables of the restaurant, please.**

Waiter: **Excuse me, sir. That is not possible.**

**I can't give you every / each table here.**

Customer: **How many / much tables do you have left?**

Waiter: **There are some / little ... Let me see... Wait here a moment, please.**

★ Restaurant Owner: **So... How many / much friends are coming to your birthday party?**

Customer: **Just a few / some... Is there enough room for 500 people?**

Restaurant Owner: **Are you serious? That's a lot / too much of people! I can offer you the terrace for a little / a few more money.**

Customer: **How much / many?**

Restaurant owner: **5,000 dollars every / all space.**

Customer: **Ok, I will take it**
