

# HOW MUCH? - HOW MANY?

## 1. QUANTITY OR AMOUNT

МЫ ИСПОЛЬЗУЕМ HOW MUCH ИЛИ HOW MANY ЧТОБЫ УЗНАТЬ КОЛИЧЕСТВО ЧЕГО-ТО.

MUCH + НЕИСЧЕСЛЯЕМОЕ СУЩЕСТВИТЕЛЬНОЕ (НЕЛЬЗЯ ПОСЧИТАТЬ)

MANY + ИСЧЕСЛЯЕМОЕ СУЩЕСТВИТЕЛЬНОЕ ВО МНОЖЕСТВЕННОМ ЧИСЛЕ (МОЖНО ПОСЧИТАТЬ)

### MUCH + UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

- How much time do we have?
- How much money do you need?
- How much sugar would you like in your coffee?
- How much paper will I need?
- How much milk is in the fridge?
- How much traffic was there on the way to work?

### MANY + PLURAL COUNTABLE NOUNS

- How many days are there in January?
- How many people work in your company?
- How many cousins do you have?
- How many books did you buy?
- How many countries are there in the world?
- How many chairs are there in this room?
- How many pieces of chocolate would you like?

## 2. PRICE (ЦЕНА)

WE USE MUCH WHEN WE WANT TO KNOW THE PRICE OF SOMETHING

МЫ ИСПОЛЬЗУЕМ MUCH + СУЩЕСТВИТЕЛЬНОЕ В ЕДИНСТВЕННОМ ИЛИ  
МНОЖЕСТВЕННОМ ЧИСЛЕ, КОГДА ХОТИМ ЗНАТЬ ЦЕНУ ЧЕГО-ЛИБО

### MUCH + SINGULAR/PLURAL COUNTABLE NOUNS

- How much is that painting?
- How much are those shoes?
- How much did your jacket cost?
- How much is the dress on display in the window?
- How much will it cost me?
- How much does it cost?

## 3. OMITTING THE NOUN

ПРОПУСК СУЩЕСТВИТЕЛЬНОГО

OFTEN THE NOUN IS OMITTED IN THE QUESTION WHEN IT IS OBVIOUS WHAT WE ARE TALKING ABOUT.

ЧАСТО СУЩЕСТВИТЕЛЬНОЕ ОПУСКАЕТСЯ В ВОПРОСЕ, КОГДА ОЧЕВИДНО, О ЧЕМ МЫ ГОВОРИМ.

A: I would like to buy some cheese.

B: How much (cheese) would you like?

THE NOUN CHEESE IS NOT NECESSARY AFTER HOW MUCH SINCE WE ALREADY KNOW WE ARE TALKING ABOUT CHEESE.

МЫ УЖЕ ЗНАЕМ, ЧТО РЕЧЬ ИДЕТ О СЫРЕ, ПОЭТОМУ МЫ НЕ ИСПОЛЬЗУЕМ ЕЩЕ РАЗ ЭТО СЛОВО ПОСЛЕ HOW MUCH.



### The American diner

The American diner is a great place to eat, but it's strange for foreigners. When you sit down, someone brings you a glass of ice water. You don't <sup>1</sup> order the water – it just comes. The <sup>2</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ is not a simple list of food. It's a long list with hundreds of <sup>3</sup> \_\_\_\_\_. A <sup>4</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ in a diner can cook anything and everything!
