### First conditional



Condition



Consequence/ Result

If you **study** hard, you **will pass** the test.



Condition



Consequence/ Result

If you **wake up** late, you **will miss** the bus.



Condition



Consequence/ Result

If you **aren't going** to the party, I'm **not going to go** either.

**Use:** To talk about something that **will probably happen** in the future if some conditions occur.

**If + present, future**

**Condition:** If + simple present/ pres. cont

**Consequence:** future (will/ going to)

B Yes, I'll miss you, too. Before I <sup>21</sup> \_\_\_\_\_  
(leave), we should all go out for dinner one evening.

A Yes, that's a great idea.
