Budget Airlines

¹ Budget airlines are so called because they offer flights at ² low fares. Love them or hate them, we use them because they can save us a lot of money. But how are these companies able to offer such good prices? Well, they usually don't land at and take off from the ³ biggest airports in a country, which means that they pay less tax. Those main travel centres charge airlines high amounts to use their buildings. Secondly, budget airlines don't provide ⁴ food and drinks. However, hungry passengers can choose from a selection of snacks that are usually sold at high prices. I recently paid more than three times the usual price for a sandwich and a very small cup of coffee. Next time I take an early flight, I'll make sure I have breakfast at home. Finally, ticket prices are fixed, which means that the airline doesn't offer ⁵ refunds. If you have to cancel your flight, you won't be able to get your money back – another lesson I've learnt the hard way!
