Verb have got

We use the verb to have got to talk about something that belongs to someone.

The verb **have got** has two forms:

have got (with **I**, **you**, **we** and **they**)


has got (with **he**, **she** and **it**)

Full form


I have got
 you have got
 he has got
 she has got
 it has got
 we have got
 you have got
 they have got

Short form

I've got
 you've got
 he's got
 she's got
 it's got
 we've got
 you've got
 they've got
