

Type of Document	Definition
Specialist Documents (Dangerous Goods)	Documents required for international trade to declare the value, contents, and origin of goods, ensuring compliance with laws, and determining duties and taxes.
Bill of Lading	Specific documents required for transporting goods that are hazardous, containing information about the nature of the goods, risks, and handling instructions.
Customs Documents	Instructions or documents used when goods are to be picked up, detailing what is being collected, where, and by whom.
Consignment Notes	An overview document that lists all items in a shipment, quantities, and other relevant information for quick reference.
Delivery Docket	A document issued by a carrier acknowledging receipt of goods and details about the sender, receiver, and the goods being transported.
Summary Sheet	A legal document detailing the type, quantity, and destination of the goods being carried, serving also as a receipt of shipment.
Collection Note	A document that accompanies a shipment of goods and details the contents and instructions for handling and delivery.
