

Pronouncing the Vowel o

The letter *o* is pronounced many different ways in English. In the words *hotel*, *shop*, *come*, *woman*, and *move*, the letter *o* is pronounced five different ways. Sometimes the letters around *o* can help you guess how to pronounce the vowel, but not always.

▶ **Read and listen to the example. Notice how the letter *o* is pronounced. Is it pronounced the same in any of the words?**

Example

The long-necked women of Padaung talk with tourists, pose for pictures, and sell souvenirs. They have become an important source of commerce and money in small villages along the Thai / Myanmar border.

	Spelling	Pronunciation Tips
a)	<i>o</i> + a consonant + silent <i>e</i> <i>home, bone, pose, hope, close</i>	<i>/ow/</i> , like the vowel in <i>go</i> . Keep rounding your lips.
b)	<i>o</i> + one or more consonants <i>shop, lot, job, commerce, problem</i>	<i>/a/</i> , like the vowel in <i>father</i> ; this vowel has no "o" sound. Do not round your lips.
c)	<i>o</i> + <i>ng, ss, st, ll, ff</i> <i>long, boss, lost, collar, office</i>	<i>/ɔ/</i> , like the vowel in <i>law</i> . This vowel is like <i>/a/</i> , but the lips are a little rounded. NOTE: Some Americans pronounce these words with <i>/a/</i> , like the vowel in <i>father</i> . You can use this vowel, too.
	Exceptions	
d)	<i>come, mother, brother, love, other</i>	<i>/ə/</i> , like the vowel in <i>cut</i> . Your mouth is almost closed.
e)	<i>move, lose</i>	<i>/uw/</i> , like the vowel in <i>do</i>
f)	<i>woman</i>	<i>/u/</i> , like the vowel in <i>could</i>
g)	<i>women</i>	<i>/ɪ/</i> , like the vowel in <i>sit</i>
