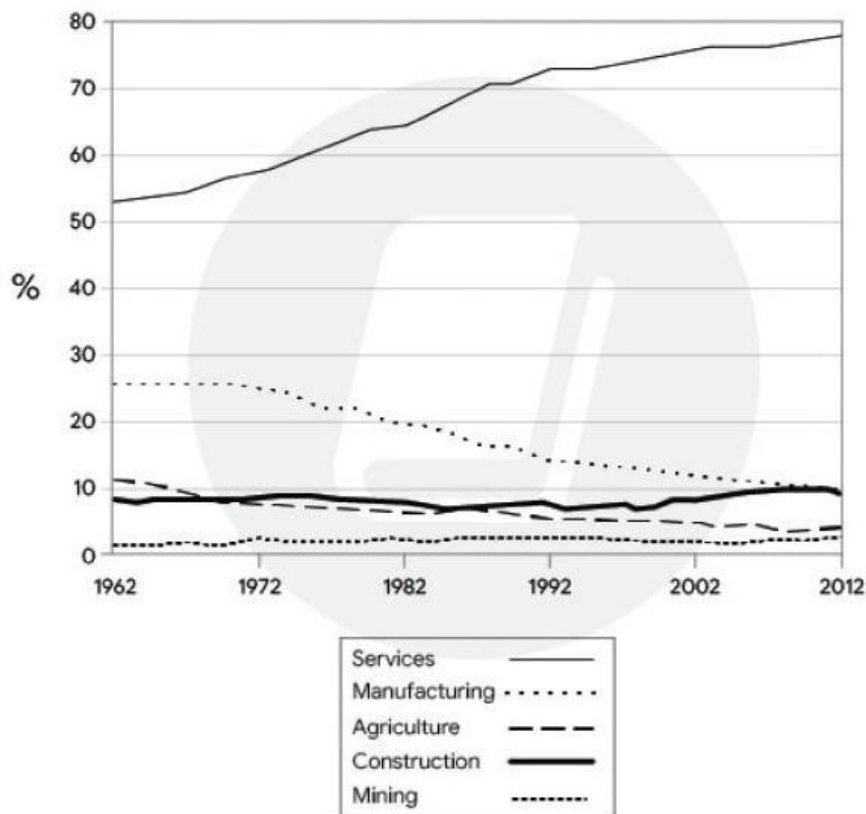


**Percentage of Australian workforce in five industries

The line graph illustrates the proportion of the workforce in Australia in different sectors over a 50-year period from 1962 to 2012.

Overall, the trends for construction and mining were relatively while the otherschanges at different paces over the period in question. Another striking feature is that while services remained by far the most industry, mining was to be the least popular during the period as whole.

In detail, in 1962, more than half of the Australian workforce were employed in service industries., its figure had soared to finish at80% by 2012, which was the highest level in the graph.

In contrast, asthe manufacturing industry, with the initial percentage of approximately 26%, it had witnessed a gradualuntil the end of the....., dropping to exactly 10%. Similarly, the agricultural sector mirrored this downward trend, although it declined at a much slower pace,steadily from just over 10% to roughly 5% in 2012.

Meanwhile, with respect to the construction, workers in this industry comprised just under one-tenth of the total workforce in the first year, after which the figurepractically unchanged until 2002. Then it grew marginally to reach the same level as that of manufacturing in 2012. A similar pattern was observed in the mining workforce,hovering at around 2%.
