This month, John Hitchens explores Chinese art. During a morning stroll in Beijing's Beihai Park, he encountered elderly individuals painting on pavements with meter-long brushes, a practice known as water calligraphy. Despite the ephemeral nature of these creations, which vanish swiftly, they hold artistic and symbolic significance. Similarly, Harbin's Ice Festival showcases immense ice sculptures, attracting artists and tourists worldwide despite the challenging working conditions brought by the city's freezing winters.
