_____ (22) conditionals and wish are used to express **hypothetical or unreal** situations in different time frames.

Mixed Second/Third Conditional: This type of mixed conditional combines elements of the _____ (23) and third conditionals. It is used to talk about _____ (24) situations in the past and their hypothetical results in the present.

Wish in the Future: Wish is also used to express desires for situations that are unlikely to happen in the future.

"If only" is also used to express wishes or regrets in English.

"If Only": is used to express regrets about _____ (38) situations that could have been different.

"If Only" + _____ (40) : This structure is used to express strong wishes about past situations that cannot be changed.
