The Mona Lisa is a half-length portrait painting by Leonardo da Vinci. It is considered as an masterpiece of the Italian Renaissance, and has been described as "the best known, the most visited, the most written about, the most sung about, the most parodied work of art". The painting's quality is due to the subject's expression, the monumentality of the composition, the subtle modelling of forms, and the atmospheric illusionism.

Mona in Italian is a polite form originated from *ma donna* – similar to *Madam* in English. This became *madonna*, and then contracted to be *mona*. The title of the painting, then is commonly spelled in modern Italian as *Monna Lisa* for the painting is likely of the Italian noblewoman Lisa Gherardini, the wife of Francesco del Giocondo. It had been believed that it had been painted between 1503 and 1506. However, Leonardo may have continued working on it as late as 1517.

The *Mona Lisa* is one of the most valuable paintings in the world. It holds the Guinness World Record for the highest known insurance valuation in history at US\$100 million in 1962 (equivalent to \$650 million in 2018). It was acquired by King Francis I of France and is now the property of the French Republic, on permanent display at the Louvre Museum in Paris since 1797.
