

Timothée Chalamet Visits Seoul

Timothée Chalamet is one of this year's most ()-after actors in Hollywood. Recently, the American () visited Korea as part of the () tour for his latest movie, "Dune: Part Two."

Chalamet came to Seoul with the director of the film, Denis Villeneuve, and his fellow () members, including co-star Zendaya and supporting actor Stellan Skarsgård. They arrived in Seoul on February 19th and stayed for four days.

During that time, the group held a press () to talk about their new movie and participated in a red-carpet event for the Korean () of the film. The Hollywood stars also took part in a big fan meeting during which they signed autographs and posed for photos.
