Remi: "I don't understand... my wife would never do that, and I swear I (not/do) that either. Maybe somebody (put) something in my bag in Dubai? I (fall) asleep in the airport!"

Guard 2: "So you're saying somebody put bananas in your backpack in Dubai airport?"

Remi: "Maybe! I (be) asleep for a long time, anybody could have... Wait (say) bananas?"

Guard 1: "Yes he did Mr Lemieux. We found two bananas in your backpack.

You (be) to Australia 6 times before, you should know that taking fruit and vegetables into the country is illegal."

Remi: "Oh my god, I (think) you found drugs in my baggage!"

Guard 2: "Are there drugs in your bag Mr Lemieux?"

Remi: "What? No! Listen, my wife never (be) to Australia before. She doesn't know about the law against taking fruit and vegetables into the country. She knows I love bananas and I guess she (decide) to put them in my backpack to surprise me."
