### 3A have to/don't have to

We use *have to* + the base form of the verb to say that something is necessary.

*I have to wear a uniform in school.*

*I have to go to work by bus.*

*My brother has to get up at 5:30 every morning.*

*Donna has to call her parents every night.*

We use *don't have to* + base form to say that something isn't necessary.

*I don't have to work on Mondays.*

*They don't have to study today. It's Sunday.*

*Carlotta doesn't have to buy a new computer. She got one for her birthday.*

*Simon doesn't have to cook dinner tonight. He's at a restaurant.*

We use *have to/don't have to* for situations in the present and in the future.

*I have to wear a uniform at work.* (present situation)

*I don't have to get up early tomorrow.* (future situation)
