Wet Waste

- _____ - Refers to all items that are not considered wet/soiled items. This includes both recyclable and non-recyclable materials. It includes items such as bottles, cans, clothing, plastic, wood, glass, metals and paper.
- _____ - Refers to all items that are organic like food items, **soiled food wrappers**, hygiene products, **yard waste**, tissues and paper towels, as well as any other **soiled item** that would **contaminate** the recyclables.
- _____ - Refers to all liquid or solid waste **originating solely** from humans and human activities. (Can also include items from medical waste)
- _____ - Refers to all household products that contain **corrosive**, toxic, **ignitable**, or reactive ingredients, other than used oil.
- _____ - Refers to all kinds of electronic waste.
- _____ - Refers to all items, products and **by-products** that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable or reactive ingredients.
- _____ - Refers to waste items that are neither chemically or **biologically reactive** nor **decompose easily**.
