Ellen's Parents Go into Hiding	●	●	She joins Annemarie and Ellen's doll play and is given the role of Scarlett's daughter Bonnie.
Annemarie's Father Offers Comfort	●	●	Annemarie's father reveals that the Nazis have collected synagogue lists containing the names and addresses of all the Danish Jews.
