THE RUBBLE CLUB

A great deal of skill, time, work and creativity are (1) **subscribed** / **invested** in the design and (2) **construction** / **implementation** of a new building. THE VOLCANO POWER TOWER

While volcanoes have the capacity to (1) **wreak / yield / discharge** terrible destruction, a new 85-meter-tall artificial volcano may soon be providing more than 100.000 homes in northern England with electricity. This revolutionary power plant will rely on biofuels rather than (2) **greenhouse / fossil / polluting** fuels like coal, and will (3) **theoretically / allegedly / inherently** be an environmentally friendly project (4) **altogether / somewhat / outright**. The artificial volcano will be powered by shells of palm nuts. These palm kernel shells are considered to be a (6) **restored / renewable / rejuvenated** source of biofuel.
