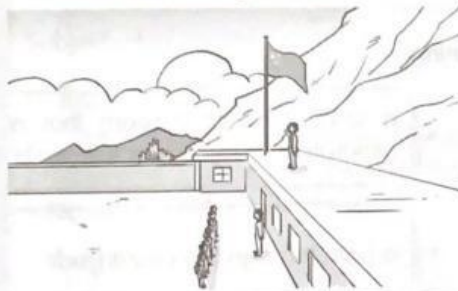

Carpe Diem School



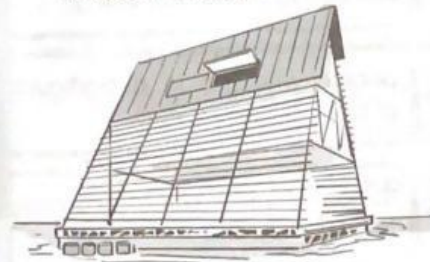

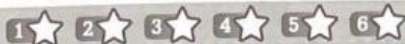
