### Pronunciation of ED

/ɪd/	/t/	/d/
<p>T wanted D needed</p> <p>* Voiced Sound = uses the vocal cords and they produce a vibration or humming sound in the throat. <i>(Touch your throat to feel it)</i></p>	<p>P helped K looked F sniffed GH laughed SH washed CH watched SS kissed C danced X fixed</p> <p style="text-align: center;">VOICELESS</p>	<p>L called N cleaned R offered G damaged V loved S used Z amazed B rubbed M claimed</p> <p style="text-align: center;">VOICED *</p>

Words that end in a vowel sound use the /d/ pronunciation for ED. e.g. – followed – enjoyed – played – tried – continued

The pronunciation of words ending in ED depends on the final consonant sound. There are three ways to pronounce ED at the end of a word in English:  
*/ɪd/ /t/ /d/*
