A healthy, balanced diet can help provide energy and lower your risks of the leading chronic diseases such as heart disease, hypertension, diabetes, and cancer. **It** can also help you maintain a normal weight. Certain diseases or conditions have proven relationships with specific nutrition or dietary elements.

Rather than jumping on the latest fad diet, however, a positive change in dietary lifestyle is what grants the greatest protection. The master of healthy eating, Michael Pollan, summed up his recommendations by stating, "Eat food. Not too much. Mostly plants." Plants give you the best chance of getting the nutrients you need by eating a rainbow of colors.

Some of the components of the Mediterranean diet include fruits and vegetables, nuts and seeds, seafood, whole grains, good extra virgin olive oil, and plenty of herbs and spices, as well as foods that do not include fat, refined grains, oils and sugar.
