The **walrus**³ is a large animal and in the past it was exploited by indigenous for its skin, fat, meat and bones. Its diet consists mainly of mollusks.

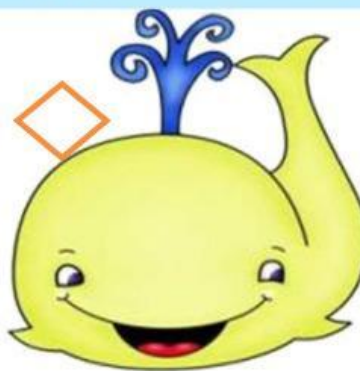
