## The man who talked to elephants

Today's post is about a real nature lover. Lawrence Anthony did a lot to protect animals around the world. He was born in South Africa in 1950. As a child, he spent hours walking in the countryside with his dog. When he grew up, he became a businessman, but that changed in the 1990s. Lawrence bought Thula Thula, a big wildlife park in South Africa, where wild animals could live safely. Tourists could stay there and go on trips to see the animals.

There were no elephants in Thula Thula, but in 1999 Lawrence was asked to take nine elephants. However, they had to stay in Thula Thula. Lawrence agreed. The elephants left the park a few times so Lawrence spent two weeks living with the group. He talked to them for hours. Slowly, the elephants became more relaxed and after that, they stayed. In 2012, Lawrence died nearly 500 kilometres away from his home in Thula Thula, but the elephants knew. They went to his house and stayed for days.

During his life, Lawrence did many other amazing things. He wrote three books. The most popular one is called *The Elephant Whisperer* and it was published in 2009. It has sold over 200,000 copies and it is going to be a film, directed by Robin Goode. In 2003, he helped to save animals in Baghdad Zoo in Iraq. He also worked hard to save other animals like the white rhino. In 2004, Lawrence started the Lawrence Anthony Earth Organisation. It works on projects to protect the natural world through education and action.
