Should we eat less meat?

Nowadays, more people choose to eat less meat, whether this means eating fewer meals containing meat each week or giving up meat for certain days or periods. But why might people not want to eat meat? There are significant factors that influence people's choice to eat less or no meat at all.

Changing our dietary habits can have good impact on the environment. A global study by 11,000 scientists shows that meat production is one of the most destructive human activities for our planet. For example, cows emit harmful gases into the air such as methane. According to the United Nations' Food and Agriculture Organisation's report in 2019, production of meat and dairy uses around 80% of farmland on Earth and, therefore, releases 60% of agriculture's harmful greenhouse gases.

Another problem related to meat production is deforestation as many Amazon countries cut trees in the forests to build more animal farms. This leads to the extinction of thousands of wild animals. In addition, meat producing companies use huge amounts of water. For example, it takes about 3140 litres of water to produce one meat hamburger, whereas burgers made of vegetables can use at least 75% less water. Although many climate organisations recommend large decreases in meat consumption, sadly meat consumption is growing worldwide according to a recent United Nations report that predicts an increase of 76% by 2050.

However, many countries are encouraging people to eat less meat by starting meat-free day events, such as the UK's Meat Free Mondays. Other events include Veganuary in January, Meat-Free Week in September and World Vegetarian Day in October. Many food companies have also widely responded to this new trend with an increase in vegetarian food options and recipes and more products have been launched onto the market. According to the Vegetarian Society report in 2019, between 2-3% of the population in the UK is fully vegetarian, in Brazil the percentage is between 6-8% and in Italy 15-14% of the country is vegetarian.

Doctors and dieticians in general advise us to eat a low-fat diet and consume more vegetables to help lower cholesterol and blood pressure, and this has encouraged even more people to eat less meat and more vegetables. Moreover, researchers have linked the high consumption of processed meat such as burgers and hotdogs with a higher chance of Type 2 diabetes. One study found that eating too much red meat a day

increases your chances of getting the disease by 48%. The International Agency for Research on Cancer reported that eating processed meat daily increases the risk of cancer by 18%. In an older review of 20 studies among more than 1.2 million people, researchers found that consuming processed meat appeared to increase heart disease risk by 42%.

In conclusion, any reduction you make in your meat consumption will be good for your health as well as for the environment.

Elizabeth Blackwell was born in Bristol, England in 1821. Her father, Samuel Blackwell, owned a successful sugar factory. Elizabeth had two brothers and four sisters who all went to school. In 1832, Samuel Blackwell's sugar factory was destroyed by fire. Therefore, the family decided to travel to the United States. At the time, Elizabeth was eleven years old. At first the family settled in New York City, but her father's business failed there, so they moved to Ohio City.

Samuel Blackwell was sick and he died soon after arriving in Ohio. Elizabeth and her two older sisters started teaching girls in their home to help support the family. Their two brothers found different jobs. Elizabeth was not happy about teaching.

After a few years Elizabeth began to think seriously about studying medicine, especially after the death of a friend from a serious illness. Elizabeth discussed it with her family who supported the idea. At first, she started to study medicine and science privately with a doctor who was also a medical college professor. A year later, she wrote to all medical colleges, but all rejected her as at that time women were not allowed to study medicine. Finally, however, she was accepted at Geneva Medical College in New York.

At the beginning, Elizabeth faced many problems in medical college. Some professors refused to teach her, and some students threatened her. But she was strong and did not give up. In 1849, Elizabeth graduated with high honors. She was the only woman in the western world to have completed medical college training at that time.

Three months later, Doctor Elizabeth Blackwell went to Paris to learn surgery. A hospital for women and babies agreed to let her train there. At the hospital, Elizabeth accidentally got a liquid chemical in her eye which blinded her, so she gave up her dreams of becoming a surgeon.

Elizabeth returned to the United States in 1851 and opened a clinic in New York City, but no patients came, so she opened a clinic in a poor part of the city to help people who lived under difficult conditions. Elizabeth's work with the poor led her to believe that doctors could help people more effectively by preventing sickness. She started a program in which doctors visited patients in their homes. The doctors taught patients how to clean the houses and how to prepare food so that sickness could be prevented.

In 1860, Elizabeth raised the money to open a hospital in a re-built house and people in New York started to accept her work. Then, in 1868, she opened a medical college for women. She taught the women students about disease prevention. It was the first time that the idea of preventing disease was taught in a medical college. Later, other medical schools for women were opened in Boston and Philadelphia.

Elizabeth returned to England in 1891. She wrote books and made speeches about disease prevention. Her speeches focused mainly on the dangers of eating poor food and of living in dirty conditions. Her best advice to doctors was that preventing diseases from happening was their true responsibility. Elizabeth Blackwell died in England in 1910 at the age of eighty-nine. She is an inspiration.
