1. Look up to: To admire or respect someone.
2. Look up: To search for information in a reference book or database.

Get

- Gets on with: To have a good relationship with someone.
- Get away to: To go on a trip, especially for relaxation.
- Get up to: To be involved in something, often something mischievous or surprising.
- Get out of: To avoid doing something; to leave a place.
- Get away with: To escape punishment or consequences for something.
- Get out with: This seems unusual, but if intended as "go out with," it means to date someone.

Make

- Make up: To invent a story or excuse; to reconcile after an argument.
- Make up for: To compensate for something bad or inadequate by doing something good.

Go

- Go through with: To complete or proceed with a planned action or decision, especially one that is difficult or challenging.
- Go back: To return to a place or a previous state.
- Go back on: To fail to keep a promise or agreement.
- Go in: To enter a place.
- Go in for: To take part in a competition; to have a particular interest or hobby.

1. Put up with: To tolerate or endure something unpleasant or difficult.
2. Lives up to: To meet or fulfill expectations or standards.
3. Run out of: To use up the available supply of something.
4. Walks out on: To leave someone suddenly and unexpectedly, often abandoning responsibilities.
5. Catches up with: To reach the same level or position as someone else after falling behind.
6. Signs up for: To enroll or register for something, such as a course or activity.
7. Fits in with: To feel comfortable and accepted within a group or environment.
