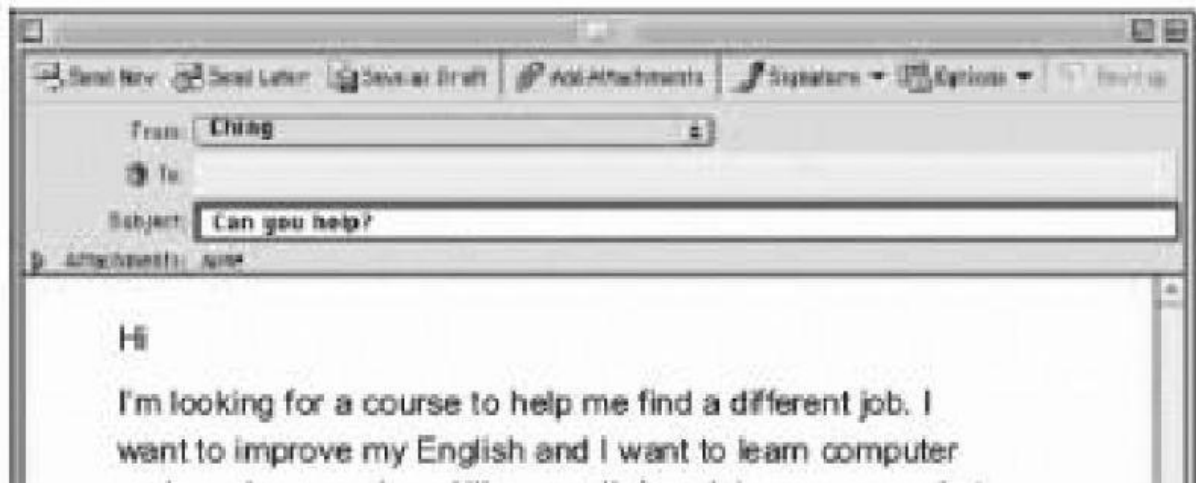

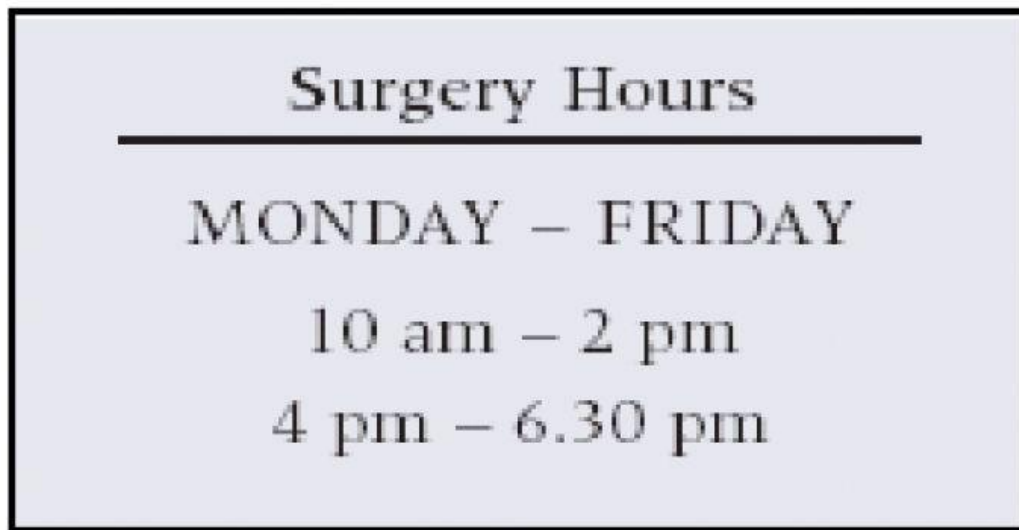

USC loses respected, influential professor

Paul Fidler dies after six-year battle with leukemia

USC lost an icon earlier this month with the death of distinguished professor and former administrator Paul Fidler.

In his 35 years at USC, Fidler was a professor of higher education and held various student service positions. He retired in 1999 and died June 22 in Boston after fighting leukemia for nearly six years.

A memorial service honoring his life will be held Tuesday at 4 p.m. at Trumbull Road United Methodist Church.

Fidler was revered by colleagues and students alike. USC's annual Fidler 5K charity run, which Stensland was organized as a tribute by some of the students Fidler helped at USC. That event, which began in 1998, has raised thousands of dollars for leukemia research.

Fidler attended last year's run, although he was too ill to participate.

Fidler's accomplishments at USC include creating its Career Center, Academic Planning Office and student Awards Day. He also established the USC chapter of the Omicron Delta Kappa student honor society.

During the tense campus protests in the late 1960s, Fidler was a mediator between USC administrators and students.

Fidler was awarded the South Carolina Order of the Silver Cypress in 2001 for outstanding achievement in community service.

Despite his accomplishments, Fidler always was extremely modest — a rare trait on a college campus, said John Gardner, former director of USC's "University 101" freshman program.

"He wasn't the kind of person who grabbed a lot of attention for himself," Gardner said. "I also never heard him say an unkind word about a student and never heard anybody say anything negative about him."

Even as his illness overtook him, Fidler refused to feel sorry for himself or let it break his spirit. "When you'd call him up, he always showed the conversation back to you and how you were doing," Gardner said. "That was vintage Paul."

Fidler is survived by his wife, Dorothy, a former psychology professor at USC, and two children, Paul Perry Fidler and Cheryl Lynn Fidler Williams.

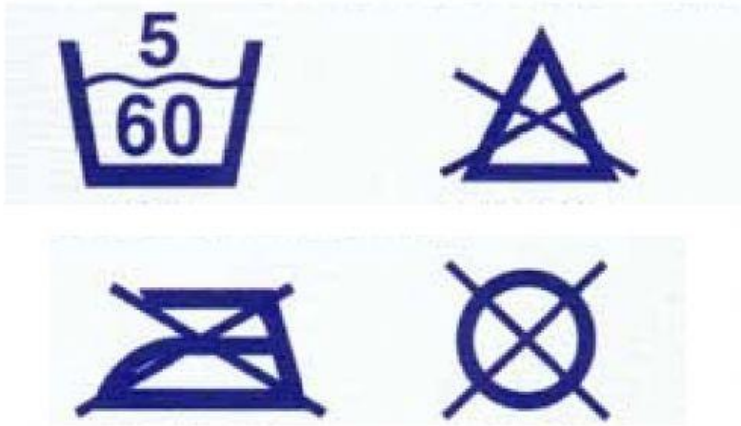
