One-syllable	-er	-est	tall → taller → tallest
ending in 'e'	-r	-st	fine → finer → finest
ending in CVC	Double the final consonant and add -er	Double the final consonant and add -est	big → bigger → biggest
Two-syllable ending in 'y'	-ier	-iest	happy → happier → happiest
Two-syllable or more syllables	More + adjective	Most + adjective	pleasant → more pleasant → most pleasant
ending in 'ed' or 'ing'	More + adjective	Most + adjective	Boring → more boring → most boring
Comparative with 'as... as'	as + adjective + adjective		She is <u>as</u> tall <u>as</u> her brother.
Negative comparison with 'not as... as'	not as + adjective + adjective		This book is <u>not as</u> interesting <u>as</u> the one I read last week.
