Writing task: "The Importance of My Profession in Society"

Use the following questions to help you plan your essay.

Questions:

1. What is the name of the profession you are going to write about?
2. When and how you decided about your career.
3. Which events have been essential to life do you want to write about?

Guidelines and Questions for Each Paragraph:

Introduction:

Purpose: Introduce the topic and provide a thesis statement.

Questions to consider:

What is your profession?

Why did you choose this profession?

What is the main idea you want to convey about the importance of your profession?

Paragraph 1: Description of the Profession

Purpose: Provide a detailed description of the profession.

Questions to consider:

What does your profession involve?

What skills and qualifications are required for this profession?

How long have you been in this profession?

Paragraph 2: Daily Responsibilities

Purpose: Describe the daily tasks and responsibilities associated with your profession.

Questions to consider:

What are your daily duties and tasks?

What challenges do you face in your daily work?

How do you overcome these challenges?

Paragraph 3: Impact on Society

Purpose: Explain how your profession contributes to society.

Questions to consider:

How does your profession benefit the community or society as a whole?

Can you provide examples of the positive impact of your profession?

Why is your profession essential in today's world?

Paragraph 4: Personal Experience and Motivation

Purpose: Share personal experiences and motivations for choosing this profession.

Questions to consider:

What inspired you to choose this profession?

What personal experiences have you had that highlight the importance of your profession?

How do you feel about your role in society?

Conclusion:

Purpose: Summarize the main points and restate the thesis in a broader context.

Questions to consider:

What are the key takeaways about the importance of your profession?

How do you see the future of your profession?

What final thoughts do you want to leave with the reader?
