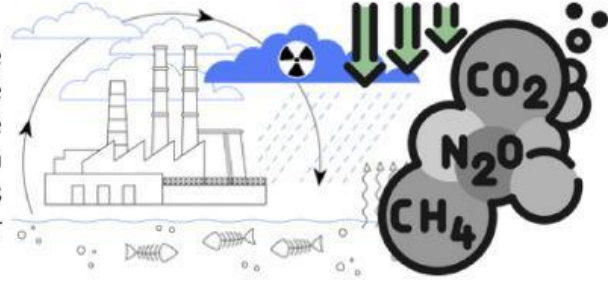




THE EFFECTS OF POLLUTION
