Count & Noncount Nouns

- Count nouns are nouns that we can count. They have singular and plural forms.
- Noncount nouns are nouns that we can't count. They only have singular forms.
- We can use **some** with both plural count nouns and noncount nouns.

a leaf	some leaves
an orange	some oranges
an onion	some onions
	a music
	a money
	a bread
	a tea
	a juice
	a soup
	three musics
	four moneys
	some breads
	some teas
	some juices
	some soups
