THE HUNTING OF WHALES

Whales produce sounds to communicate with other whales. When they make these calls, they are indicating where they are and what they are doing. Water is an excellent means* for conducting sound. The sounds are so extremely loud that whales can communicate over hundreds or thousands of miles. Biologists and experts are worried about whales because boats and other human activities produce noise pollution** in the ocean and that is not good for the communication system of whales.
