I'm going to take a vacation next month.  10.9

I'm not going to study English.

Are you going to fly to Paris?

- We use *be going to* + verb (base form) to talk about future plans.
- We often use future time expressions with *going to*, e.g., *tomorrow*, *next week*, *next month*, *next year*, etc.
