* Voiced Sound = uses the vocal cords and they produce a vibration or humming sound in the throat. (Touch your throat to feel it!)		
Words that end in a vowel sound use the /ɪd/ pronunciation for ED. e.g. -- played -- freed -- tried -- followed -- continued		

The pronunciation of words ending in ED depends on the final consonant sound. There are three ways to pronounce ED at the end of a word in English:

/ɪd/ /t/ /d/
