

SHORT AGREEMENTS USING “NEITHER / NOR” AND “SO”

To agree with an affirmative statement we use :

So + auxiliary verb / modal verb + subject

Examples:

- *“Sarah has bought a new jacket.”*
- *“So has Susan.”*
- *“We are glad you are here.”*
- *“So am I.”*

To agree with a negative statement we use :

Neither / Nor + auxiliary verb / modal verb + subject

Examples:

- *“We don’t like the hotel.”*
- *“Neither / Nor do I.”*
- *“They haven’t got any money.”*
- *“Neither / Nor have we.”*
